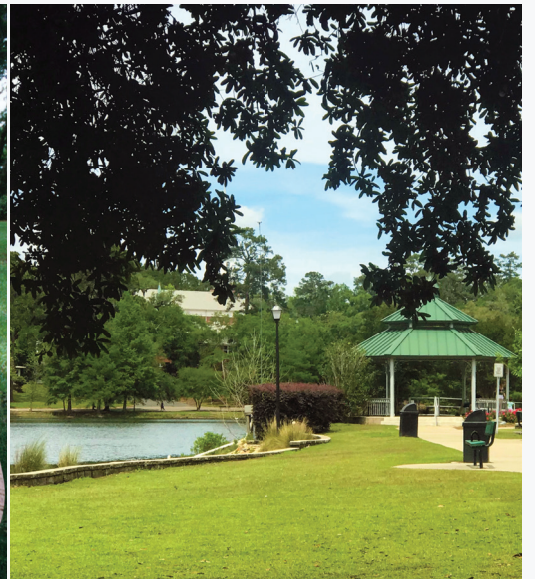
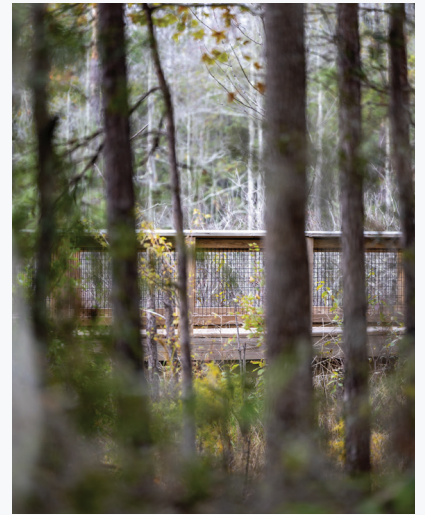


## 100 PARKS, 100 WAYS TO EXPLORE THE GREAT OUTDOORS
